Raja Rao, who is being conferred with the prestigious award of Sangeetha Kalasarathy for the year 2024 by, Sri Parthasarathy Swamy Sabha, is veritably a multi dimensional personality and a multi talented artist — an internationally acclaimed mridangist, an artist who is also well versed in vocal music, though not a performing artist, a well respected teacher and a Margadarsi for many artists and students of music and above all, a talented organizer. Hailing from a family dedicated to Carnatic music, particularly percussion, for well over four generations, Sri Raja Rao, has to his credit, a musical career spanning over six decades. Considering that Sri Raja Rao's father, Sri Venkataramana Rao, had training in both mridangam and vocal music, simultaneously, under Thanjavur Ramadass Rao and the legendary Ariyakudi Ramanuja Iyengar, respectively,

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

there is no surprise that Sri Raja Rao was able to acquire equal competence in both percussion and vocal music, though he took to percussion as a career in keeping with his family tradition. Sri Raja Rao had his initial training in mridangam under his father and later under the well known guru, Sri Kumbakonam Rajappa lyer. Sri Raja Rao says that he fulfilled his father's wish by training himself to be a competent vocalist also, coached initially, by Sri Mayavaram Vaidyanatha lyer and later by the renowned Sri Calcutta Krishnamurthy. After he moved from Srimushnam to Chennai, he also had the unique fortune to stay in the 'out house' of the great composer, Sri Papanasam Sivan, for a few months, along with one of Sivan's primary disciples.

Even as a young boy, Sri Raja Rao had the opportunity to accompany senior vocalists. One of his early achievements was to get exemption to perform in the All India Radio, even before he could become a graded artist, for which the minimum age was sixteen.

Sri Raja Rao who is proud about his connection with Sri Parthasarathy Swamy Sabha dating back to the 1980s, recalls how he had the opportunity to associate himself with the task of organizing the concerts of the Sabha, along with the office bearers of the Sabha.

His organizing skills found full expression after Sri Raja Rao became one of the Secretaries of Sri Thyaga Brahma Mahotsave Sabha, Tiruvaiyaru. His association with the Mahotsava Sabha had its origins over 50 years back, when he, under the guidance of the great mridangist, Late Sri Thanjavur Upendran, involved himself in matters relating to organising of concerts. Over the years, he became one of the two Secretaries of the Mahotsava Sabha, a post that he is holding for over 15 years. By virtue of holding a post which requires dealing with hundreds of artists every year when the Thyagaraja Aradhana is conducted, Sri Raja Rao, a naturally very affable and humble person, has endeared himself to hundreds of artists of all seniorities and ages.

Sri Raja Rao, who has been accompanying many reputed artists in their trips abroad, has to his credit, several awards received both in India and abroad, of which, Kalaimamani from the Govt of Tamilnadu, Sangeetha Choodamani from Krishna Gana Sabha, Tamil Isai Vendar from Karthik Fine Arts, Sangeetha Kalasikhamani from The Indian Fine Arts Society, Sangeetha Kala Nipuna from The Mylapore Fine Arts Club and Nada Brahmam from Narada Gana Sabha are noteworthy. Sri Raja Rao has been honoured with the title of 'Asthana Vidwan' by many Mutts and Peetams, such as, Sri Sharada Peetam, Sringeri. Sri Raja Rao has also given many solo performances and lecture demonstrations in both India and abroad.

Among his many accomplishments, such as, being an exponent of Kanjira and Mohersing, Sri Raja Rao has also composed many Krithis and Thillanas in Kannada and Tamil, besides tuning several compositions of Saint Purandaradasa, whose compositions he has been propagating.

Sri Raja Rao, over the past many years, has trained several artists, not only in percussion but also in vocal music. A strict adherent to tradition that he is, Sri Raja Rao has also been following the 'Gurukula' method of training at his residence in Chennai. Among his many disciples, are such talented and busy percussion artists as, Poongulam Subramaniam, M. S. Venkatasubramanian, Neyveli Ramkumar and Nanganallur Swaminathan, a busy Ghatam player.

Sri Raja Rao's wife, Padma is the daughter of the well known novelist, Sandilyan and their only son, Raghavendra Raja Rao, is a busy music composer and lyric writer in the Tamil film industry, known by the name, Sean Roldan..

இந்த விருதினைப் பற்றிக் கேட்ட போது ருக்மிணிரமணி மனம் நெகிழ்ந்து கூறினார், "நூறு ஆண்டுகளுக்கு மேல் கர்னாடக இசையினைப் போற்றி வளர்த்து வரும் பார்த்தசாரதி ஸ்வாமி சபா என்மனதுக்கு மிகவும் நெருக்கமானது. சபாவை

நடத்தி வருபவர்கள் கலைஞர்கள் மீது மட்டுமின்றி, ரசிகர்கள் மீதும் அன்பும், மரியாதையும், எளிமையும் நிறைந்தவர்கள். என் மகன் அசோக் ரமணியும் இந்த சபா அளித்த விருதைப் பெற்றவர் என்ற மகிழ்ச்சி இப்போது இரட்டிப்பாகிறது" என்றார் ருக்மிணி.

ருக்மிணியின் இசைப்பயணம் தந்தையில் வழிகாட்டுதலினால் சிறு வயதினிலேயே அரும்புவிட்டது. நாளடைவில் இசையின் நுணுக்கங்கள் இரத்ததுடன் கலந்து தமிழின் ஆளுமை நாடி நரம்புகளில் வியாபித்து நின்று, இவரது இசையின் பெருமை மலர்ந்து மணம் வீசத் தொடங்கியது.

தன் தந்தையின் பெயரில் "சிவன் ஆர்ட்ஸ் அகாடமி" என்ற இசைப்பள்ளியை நான்கு வேறு இடங்களில் சென்னையில் நிறுவி வெற்றிகரமாக நடத்தி வருகிறார். இதில் பயின்ற பல மாணவ மாணவிகள், இசையில் தேர்ச்சி பெற்று, ஆசிரியர்களாகவும், மேடைக் கலைஞர்களாகவும் விளங்குகின்றார்கள். இப்பள்ளிகளில் வாய்ப்பாட்டு மட்டுமின்றி, வயலின், கீபோர்டு, வீணை ஆகியவையும் கற்றுத் தரப்படுகிறது.

இவர் மீதுள்ள அபரிமிதமான அன்பினாலும், மரியாதையாலும், இவரது மாணவர்கள் பன்னிருவர் இணைந்து, "சிவானுக்ரஹ" என்ற அமைப்பை நிறுவி இதன் மூலம் ஆசிரியர் ருக்மிணிரமணியின் அற்புதப் படைப்புக்களை மேடையேற்றுகின்றனர்; புத்தகங்களாக வெளியிடுகிறனர், போட்டிகள் வைத்து இளம் மாணவ மாணவிகள் குரு ருக்மிணியின் படைப்புகளை அறிந்து கொள்ள வழிவகுக்கிறனர்.

இவரது போற்றத்தக்க உந்து தலில் உருவாகிய போற்றத்தக்க இசை நாட்டிய நாடகங்கள் ஏராளம். ராகவேந்திரா, மீரா, தான் தோன்றிப் பெருமாள், ராமாயணத்தில் நவரஸம், தேவமாதர்கள், அறுபடை வீடு, வீரம் விளைந்த பூமி' என்னும் நமது நாட்டு சுதந்திரப் போராட்ட வீரர்கள் சரித்திரம்..... இன்னும் பலப்பல இவருக்கு, இவரது படைப்புத்திறமைக்கு கட்டியம் கூறும் வகையில் அமைந்தவை.

தமிழிலும் மணிப்பிரவாள மொழியிலும், சம்ஸ்க்ருதத்திலும் இவர் இயற்றிய க்ருதிகள் கணக்கில் அடங்காதவை. 108 திவ்ய தேசம், திருவாரூர் பஞ்சரத்னம், கபாலீஸ்வரர் பஞ்சரத்னம், பன்னிரண்டுஜோதிர்லிங்க பஞ்சபூதக் கிருதிகள், சப்த விடங்கக் க்ருதிகள் போன்றவை மிகவும் பிரபலமானவை. இவரது கீர்த்தனைகளை முன்னணிக் கலைஞர்களான சுதா ரகுனாதன், சௌம்யா, காயத்ரி கிரீஷ் போன்றவர்கள் அடிக்கடி மேடையில் பாடி ரசிகளைக் கவர்கின்றரர்.

audience. This program offered a comprehensive introduction to ragas for general audience to inculcate musical knowledge.

I have had the privilege of collaborating with numerous esteemed musicians, both established and emerging. As I pass the torch to the next generation, I urge them to cherish and preserve our rich musical heritage.

I am humbled and privileged to tread the path illuminated by my beloved Guru and luminaries such as Dwaram Venkataswami Naidu Garu.

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
# Gottuvadyam Narayana Iyengar Award: Ghatam Dr. S. Karthick

Q: How long have you been on this musical journey?

A: I am 53 years old and started performing at 14. This marks my 38th year in music, filled with enriching experiences.

Q: What did you learn from your gurus VikkuVinayakram and SubhashChandran?

A:Vikku sir taught me the fundamentals and concertspecific techniques, while Subhash sir introduced me to the mathematical intricacies of rhythm. I've been with my guru for 45 years since joining his class at age 8, which has been a transformative journey.



A: My thesis focused on "Musical Instruments in Sanskrit Literature," which drew from my background as a Sanskrit student during my academic years.

Q: What inspired your diverse compositions?

A: My mother, a singer, nurtured my musical ear early on. I also trained in vocal music under ThiruvengaduJayaraman and Vairamangalam Lakshmi Narayanan. My love for wordplay often led me to use raga mudras and swaraksharas, and many of my works have been adopted by dancers.

Q: What is your involvement in film music?

A: I've collaborated with legendary composers like llayaraja, A. R. Rahman, Harris Jayaraj, and others. My contributions span several genres and creative endeavors.

Q: You're known for your creativity.

A: Thank you! I've explored unique genres, including Tamil ghazals. I also enjoy creative pursuits like mimicry and collaborating with Hindustani musicians.

Q: Do your students from abroad start from scratch?

A: Most are accomplished musicians who want to learn ghatam or konnakkol as an additional skill to expand their expertise.

Q: Tell us about your troupe.

A: My troupe, Heart Beat, recently celebrated 25 years of musical excellence, marking a significant milestone in our journey together.

Q: How long have you been associated with Sri Parthasarathy Swami Sabha?

A: For nearly three decades, starting in my teenage years, this association has been a source of immense pride and joy.

Q: Congratulations on receiving the Gottuvadhyam Narayana Iyengar award.

A: Thank you! This award, honoring special instruments, is particularly meaningful coming from India's oldest sabha. I have fond memories of attending concerts here as a child, making this recognition deeply special and nostalgic.

In 1905 the discourses of Rao Bahadur Prof. M. Rangachari on 'Srimad Bhagavad Geethai' was released in book form in Three Volumes.



In 1906, Pandit Madhan Mohan Malaviya delivered a lecture in the Sabha on Music and Education.

He was posthumously conferred with Bharat Ratna in the year 2015.

# Palghat Mani Iyer Centenary Award: Thrissur Sri Narendran

Sri Narendran was born in the town of Kunnamkulam in Thrissur District in Kerala. He learnt mridangam at a very young age and his performance career started when he was just 9 years old. It was Sri David Bhagavatar of Kunnamkulam, who inspired him to pursue the art form then on. In his early years, he had the rare privilege of playing for stalwarts in Kerala such as Chembai Vaidyanatha Bhagavatar, Palghat Sri K. V. Narayanaswamy, Sri Puducode Krishnamurthy and others at many venues across the state.

He moved to Chennai in the year 1973 and has been performing at the December Music Season continuously thereon. He is delighted to receive the prestigious Palghat Mani Iyer Centenary Award from Sri Parthasarathy Swami Sabha as he commences his 52nd year of performing at the Season. As with the legion of loyal rasikas, he is keenly looking forward to

performing at the Sabha.

K n o w n a s 'Kunnamkulam Narendran' in his early years, it was Sri Palghat KV Narayanaswamy who christened him as 'Thrissur Narendran' as he started performing for All India Radio in the early 1970s. He is fortunate to have had a long tutelage under Sri Palghat Raghu. It was his dream to master the art form and play like him. The biggest compliment to him

is when musicians and rasikas identify some of his concert recordings as that of Sri Raghu's. His mantra is to keep playing like his guru, strongly adhering to his laya patantaram. He recalls with fondness the times when he had carried three mridangams of his master to concerts



at RR Sabha and other venues.

The trio of Sri Palghat Raghu, Sri K. V. Narayanaswami and Sri T. M. Thyagarajan has the biggest influence in his career and life. He dedicates his musical journey to them. Adhering to the sampradayam and patantaram of one's gurus, accompanying them to as many concerts one can in order to deeply internalise their playing style, the art

of playing for kritis to the role of silence to mastering the nuances of tani avartanam are his pointers for the young generation of mridangam vidwans.

# Isai Methai G. Ramanathan Award : Isai Mazhalai Sri Ramjhi

Q: Can you tell us about your first musical venture?

Ramjji: My journey began in the early 1970s with a Western music troupe called Frustrations Amalgamated. In 1976, I started a Tamil film music troupe named Abaswaram ("off-note") to stand out in a crowded field. To grab attention, we used unconventional tactics, such as distributing cotton buds and headache pills during shows. These stunts helped us gain recognition.

Q: How were these methods received?

Ramjji: Traditionalists were critical, but audiences appreciated our creativity and uncompromising quality. Eventually, our success won over even our critics, and we became a leading troupe.

Q: You later created the Isai Mazhalai program for children. Can you share more about it?

Ramjji: After years with the troupe, I wanted to innovate and create a platform exclusively for young singers. In 1999, we launched Isai Mazhalai after scouting talented children from schools and conducting rigorous rehearsals. Although I was initially apprehensive, the show was a resounding success, drawing full houses and later being televised for 14 weeks. Over time, we explored new formats with child artists, making the program a global sensation.

Q: How many artists did the initiative nurture?

Ramjji: Over two decades, Isai Mazhalai nurtured and trained around 240 professional musicians. Many have become Carnatic

vocalists, playback singers, composers, and instrumentalists. This initiative was a labor of love, but the pandemic eventually brought it to an end.

Q: Congratulations on the Isai Medhai G. Ramanathan award. How do you feel about this honor?

Ramjji: I'm deeply honored. Sri Parthasarathy Swami Sabha has been a constant supporter, offering platforms for our child artists and facilitating music classes at nominal fees in Triplicane. My connection with G. Ramanathan is especially meaningful. He was close to my parents, and as a child, I often visited his home and watched him rehearse. His legacy continues to inspire me.

Q: Are you satisfied with your musical journey?

Ramjji: Absolutely. At 76, I am proud of what we've achieved and the passion for music we've instilled in young artists.

Q: Thank you for your contributions to music, and congratulations once again.

Ramjji: Thank you. It has been a deeply fulfilling journey.
